



Try to create an environment where crime is unlikely to occur, by arranging women's toilets in a place where it's bright with no blind spot, setting up places for drying clothes where they don't have to worry about male's watching, nursing rooms, women's only household spaces and so on.

- Make evacuation shelter rules.
- Appoint multiple female operators.
- Arrange toilets and dedicated spaces for women only (children included).

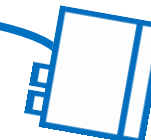

① ~To Everyone Who Runs Evacuation Shelters~

We would like to express our sincere sympathy to everyone who was affected by the disaster.

We have created this disaster prevention/crime prevention pamphlet "Ao-no Mamori"(for evacuation shelter operators), so that many people affected by a disaster, starting by protecting women and children who are likely to be victimized, will not be involved in troubles such as crime in the evacuation shelter life at the time of a major disaster.

Please make full use of it for the operation of evacuation shelters where everyone affected can live with peace of mind.



Have outsiders sign in at reception so they can be identified. Provide them with an arm band or something to mark they have registered in order to prevent intrusion by suspicious individuals.  
Look around the vicinity with the people in the shelters to identify the dangerous areas.

- Thorough preparation and management of emergency evacuation forms.
- Be sure to have outsiders sign in at reception to ensure they are identified.
- Understand the hazards around the evacuation shelters.

② ~ Listen to the Voice of Experience ~

- An increase in violence towards women and children.
- Opinions of women and children were not reflected.
- Gender roles were carried out.

It is internationally known that women and children are liable to suffer violence including sexual offences at the time of a major disaster.

Most of the operations of shelters were carried out by men, whereas women were responsible for tasks/chores such as cooking. In many cases, their roles were decided by gender, and the requests and opinions of women and children about shelter environments, distribution of goods and so on were not taken into effect.



- Make the rounds at night.
  - Create an environment that does not allow violence.
- Make the rounds to appeal in multiple mixed groups, asking for the cooperation of the safe community promoters while working to maintain the safety inside the evacuation shelters.
- In addition, people who run the evacuation shelters should unite, work together with a firm attitude and notify the police without hesitation when crime occurs. Create an environment that does not allow violence.

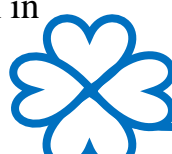

③ ~ Being Consulted? ~

- For crime such as sexual offences and theft  
Please notify the jurisdiction police station. In case of emergency, call 110 immediately.
- Domestic Violence/Stalking  
Be sure to pay attention to the handling of emergency evacuation forms. Urge the victims to report to the jurisdictional police station and instruct them to inform the police of their whereabouts.

- Reflecting diversified needs.
  - Setting up consultation counters.
- It is important to take into account the diversity of victims in the evacuation shelter operation. Create safe and secure evacuation shelters by utilizing opinions from the persons in need of assistance, such as elderly people, pregnant women, among others (making use of "request forms" and "questionnaires" and setting up foreign language notation in consideration of non-native Japanese speakers).
- Set up the counters where you can appoint female counselors in cooperation with the centre of Gender Equality and private support organizations.  
Try to solve problems before crime occurs.
